Wars. There were poems and prayers read, and a two minute silence, along with laying poppies that the classes had made at the altar.


This Friday we are allowed to wear spots on our shirts, a spotty tie and many more, just as long as we keep to our school uniform, this is to raise money for children in need.


As well as all of this, the dodgeball team were taken to an event where they came first place! Well done.
