Our recipe

This is our school Christmas Pudding recipe; it is vegetarian and nut free. These quantities make an extra-large pudding so you may want to halve them to make a smaller family sized pudding.

170g plain flour 170g vegetable suet 230g dark brown sugar 1tsp baking powder 1 ½ tsp mixed spice 230g raisins 230g sultanas 340g currants 115g mixed peel 4 medium eggs Juice of one orange Juice of one lemon Juice of one lime

IMPORTANT: Sickness and illness

I am sure that it won't have escaped your notice that the winter 'bug' season AA' has well and truly arrived. I thought it might be helpful to remind you all of the following:

Sickness and diarrhoea: Children need to stay off school for **48 hours** after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea to avoid the spread of tummy bugs.

Covid: Children need to stay off school for a **minimum of three days**; this is the current government guidance: *If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day <u>after</u> they did the test.*

Coughs and colds: If your child has a light cold and is otherwise ok to be at school, please remind them about good hand hygiene and ensure they have tissues in their bookbag.

Thank you for your vital cooperation to help us keep everyone fit and well this winter.

Parent Governor Vacancy

After Christmas, we will be inviting parents to stand for election as a Parent Governor on our Governing Body. If you think you might be interested and would like to find out more about the role and the time commitment involved, please do come and have a chat with Mrs Peddie, although there is also a summary of information below which may be helpful.

Parent governors are representative parents, rather than representatives of parents.

To effectively fulfil the role, parent governors:

- Attend half termly governing body meetings and serve on committees
- attend training sessions
- guide parents regarding appropriate lines of action and procedures
- present a balanced view of issues, representing different sections of the community
- make themselves known to the parent body
- support school activities, fundraising and events

Parent governors play a vital role on governing bodies, holding the unique position of having a parental viewpoint of the school. Through the children, they have a first-hand experience of the delivery of the curriculum, and how the school is perceived from the 'consumers' point of view. This enables parent governors to bring a different perspective to the strategic management of the school.

Although being available to advise parents on appropriate routes of action is a very important aspect of the role, it is vital that parent governors do not personally become involved in individual concerns. Apart from the possibility of this jeopardising appropriate complaints and appeals procedures, no governor has the authority to act individually on behalf of the school.

Although this is a very delicate role, there is ample support and training available. Effective parent governors will find working alongside the other members of the governing body both interesting and rewarding in that their efforts will ensure that the work of the governing body fulfils its duties to all children.

Well done to the football team who played an exciting league match against Whitehill on Tuesday, winning 4 - 2!


ESFA Football Tournament
