Even if you're late ON'T PARK NEAR OUR GATE

Stopping here puts children in danger.

Parking near schools will never be an easy task, especially for schools like ours in rural locations with narrow roads and pavements. It may be tempting to try and park as close to school as possible, particularly when the weather is unpleasant. However, some parking choices are simply dangerous.

One of the worst places to park is on the double yellow lines close to, or overlapping the school gate. When this is blocked, if cars need to pull in to give way to oncoming traffic, their only option is to pull into the top of the drive by the gate – which can be filled with parents, pupils, toddlers and prams.

We have also had several complaints from local residents about vehicular access being blocked on the bend at the village green. Sadly there have also been occasions when parents have been verbally aggressive towards residents who, rightfully, have challenged dangerous parking.

Please ensure that you make safe, legal parking choices; this applies to Early Bird Club drop off, and after school clubs.

IMPORTANT: Sickness and illness reminders

Sickness and diarrhoea: Children need to stay off school for **48 hours** after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea to avoid the spread of tummy bugs.

Covid: Children need to stay off school for a **minimum of three days**; this is the current government guidance: *If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day <u>after</u> they did the test.*

Coughs and colds: If your child has a light cold and is otherwise ok to be at school, please remind them about good hand hygiene and ensure they have tissues in their bookbag.


