














### Open Session ~ Monday 30th January 3.30-5.30pm

The resident was alarmed that despite driving slowly and cautiously, they did not expect to see a young child in the road in front of their car; this could have been a dreadful accident.

One of the worst places to park is on the double yellow lines close to the school gate. When this is blocked, if cars need to pull in to give way to oncoming traffic, their only option is to pull into the top of the drive by the gate – which is filled with parents, pupils, toddlers and prams.

<u>Outdoor kit:</u> long joggers, T shirt, hoodie/fleece/jumper, trainers. Optional hat/gloves




