






#### Badminton Festival

# WORLD BOOK DAY


## Advance notice for costume planning purposes!

## Hitchin Hampers 2022 - Our 8th Year!

Another amazing year of support from our community, schools, sponsors, contributors and team members has helped 175 families at Christmas 2022.

The team starts planning early during the year, with the current cost of living crisis we were very concerned we may not be able to support the same number of people or provide meaningful amounts in supermarket vouchers for our recipients. We identify our hamper recipients through professionals; reasons can include: low income, have experienced a bereavement or trauma, have physical and or mental health difficulties. Our hampers provide support and what can be **a financially and emotionally difficult time**. They also say someone is thinking of you and **cares** about your needs.

Thankfully, with the efforts of the group and the generosity of our community we surpassed our achievements of 2021 increasing from helping 160 to 175 families.



## This week's article from our Pupil Journalists, Annie & Lily

On Monday, parents and carers were given the opportunity to come in after school at 15:30 to look at what their children have been up to in class. They could even pop into the corridor to have a closer look at the artwork displayed.

Class five had a lesson on DIPPS and DRS ABCD. DIPPS stands for Defibrillator In Public Places, DRS ABCD represents: Dangers - do not put yourself or others in danger. Response - Shake gently and shout loudly. Shout - Shout for help, call 999. Airways - Check if the airways are clear, carefully tilt the head back. Breathing - Look if they are still and feel for normal breathing. Compression - two rescue breaths and thirty chest compression, continue this until emergency arrives. Defibrillator - If a defibrillator is available, open and follow the instructions on the machine as well as the voice prompts.

Last Friday, class four children brought many different cakes, brownies, cookies and more. The cakes were absolutely delicious and class four had done an excellent job baking and bringing in the deserts. Thank you, class four and the adults and parents who helped, organize and helped with the lovely goodies.


