World Book Day is one of the highlights of the school year at St Ippolyts and this year takes place next week on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March. I wonder who the staff will be dressed as this year...?!

#### Year 2 Parents: A date for your diary

As you will know, children in Year 2 take assessments as they come to the end of Key Stage 1. These are often referred to as 'SATs' and children are assessed in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science.

The assessments take place during the month of May. There isn't a national timetable like there is for the Year 6 tests; we tend to do them towards the end of the month, before we finish for the half term break. They are not designed to be stressful for children at all, and the children will be familiar with the layout of the booklets.

After school on **Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> March**, Year 2 parents are invited to come into school to find out more about the assessments and have a look at some examples of the kind of booklets and activities that children will be doing in May. You will also be able to see samples of children's work that is considered to be 'at the expected standard'. It will also be a chance to ask the teachers any questions you may have about the assessments.

This is a drop-in session between 3.30 and 5pm and will take place in Class 2. You don't need an appointment and your children are welcome to attend with you if you want to pop in straight after school. We do hope you will be able to come along and that it will be useful for you.

## Pancake day

For those of you who don't already know, we do a yearly Pancake Day race held on Shrove Tuesday. From every house (Brontë, Morris, Seacole and Faraday), one person per year competes in the pancake race!



The first race was quite a close one between the four houses. Usually we have a final race between first and second place, in this case it was Faraday and Morris. In the end, Morris had crossed the finish line just seconds before Faraday. Congratulations to Morris and well done to everyone who participated!

Pancake Day, otherwise known as Shrove Tuesday, is the day before Ash Wednesday, the first day of lent in the Christian calendar.

Lent - the 40 days leading up to Easter - was traditionally a time of fasting on Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, most might think it is 41 days before but Sundays are not included. Shrove Tuesday is the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients. What toppings did you enjoy on your pancakes?
