



Red nose day 2023



As we are approaching the financial year end, it is important that all outstanding debts are cleared; this includes school dinners, swimming, milk etc. All debts must be cleared by 31st March at the latest (excluding PGL payment plans). Many thanks.

LONG HAIR (AND HEADLICE ...)

A reminder that children with long hair (beyond shoulders) need to have it tied back securely for school.

We have increasing numbers of children with free-flowing hair, or only the top part tied up loosely, or held back with an alice band; these styles do not tie the hair back fully enough.

We have also had a few cases of headlice reported in school this week, so please do check your child's hair regularly and treat where necessary. Hair that is tied back properly helps to prevent the spread of headlice.

Attention Class 2 parents: date change

The Class 2 assembly will be on THURSDAY 4th MAY (not Friday 5th)



Ensuring your child has excellent attendance at school is the single most powerful thing you can do to help support them with their learning and development.

Research shows that children with strong attendance do better at school academically, have stronger relationships with their friends and go on to have better life chances.

It is tempting to think that at primary school 'a few days won't matter'. However, the curriculum delivers a sequence of knowledge and skills that builds upon prior learning, meaning that time away from school can lead children to have gaps in their knowledge and understanding. Missing key concepts in for example, mathematics, can lead to children to struggle to understand trickier concepts further down the line, because the foundations are not secure.

Whilst children are unwell from time to time, we ask that you avoid other absences, and especially urge you **NOT** to take your child out of school for holidays; these absences are always unauthorized. **The minimum expectation for attendance is 95%,** anything below this level is considered a concern and we will write to you to let you know what their current attendance percentage is. Thank you so much for taking attendance seriously.
