





A reminder that our Coronation picnic takes place tomorrow. Children can wear red, white and blue clothes instead of their uniform (fingers crossed for dry weather!)




Year 6 SATs: next week

SPORTS DAY 2023!



This year's Sports Day is scheduled to take place on **Wednesday 17th May at 12.30pm** (weather permitting). In the event of Sports Day being rained off we have a reserve date booked in for Friday 19th May. We will text parents if sports day needs to be postponed; if you do not hear from us, it is safe to assume that it is going ahead.

Children are asked to wear a plain coloured T-shirt in their house colour, along with their usual PE shorts, sun hat/cap & well-fitting trainers/plimsolls. They will also need a bottle of water.

Class arrangements for next year

I thought it would be useful to include this section in the newsletter again. Class arrangements are not finalised until well into the summer term and there are several factors that impact the final groupings. The following piece is copied from Issue 25 of the newsletter (23rd March).

One of the key questions parents often have is around whether children will move into the next class or not. I know I explain this at length on guided tours for new parents, but I also know it can be tricky to understand how it works!

Where year groups are split, we make the decision based on each individual child's needs, taking into consideration a blend of factors such as age, academic performance, emotional maturity, behaviour, confidence and self-help skills.

We do not use the terms 'moving up' or 'staying down' because regardless of which classroom a child is in, they still cover the curriculum for their year group. Our teachers are really skilled at delivering the objectives for two year groups simultaneously in the mixed classes.

When you receive your child's report in July, this will contain a letter informing you of the teachers for each class, and which class your child has been allocated to.
