ENGLISH

Writing outcomes: narrative, persuasion, non-chronological report.

Grammar focus:

- single clause sentences and multi-clause sentences (using coordinating conjunctions), and multi-clause sentences (using subordinating conjunctions) broadly accurately.
- fronted adverbials and commas after fronted adverbials
- inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech i.e. a comma after the reporting clause; end punctuation within inverted commas

MATHS

Year 3

To partition numbers according to place value.

To recognise the place value of each digit in a 3 and 4- digit number

To count on and back in tens and hundreds.

Year 4
