 of the building.


Class 1 Nativity Thursday 7th December

Winter footwear

A reminder that our school uniform consists of *shoes not boots* for both boys and girls. Children are most welcome to wear boots or wellies to travel to and from school and wear at playtimes, but they need to have their usual school shoes to change into in school. Please make sure footwear is named and it is also really useful to provide your child with a peg to clip their boots together in the cloakroom. Looking ahead, if we have snow, we still have outdoor play but only if children have wellies/boots so that they don't end up with wet, cold feet all day.



Parent Consultations: New online bookings!

Parent consultations will take place in the week commencing 27th November. We are offering face to face appointments on Monday 27th November, or you may choose to have a phone call or video meetings with your child's teacher on the other days that week.

Due to the hall being unavailable, face to face appointments will take place in the classrooms; there will be a small waiting area outside each one. For this reason it would be very helpful if you do not bring children to the face-to-face consultations.

For the first time we are trying online bookings for parent consultations; these will be done via Arbor. We will send an email in advance letting you know what day/time the bookings will go live.




Year 5&6 Girls Football







