Class 1 Nativity Thursday 7th December


The children in Class One have started preparing for their performance of 'Stable by Starlight'.

Please ensure that children are booked into Early Bird via Arbor in advance of the session.



Stopping here puts children in danger.

I know that many of you share my concerns and frustrations around a small number of people who continue to park dangerously outside our school. I am very aware that it is a small minority of parents who do not comply with our plea to make safe choices, particularly by our main gates and at the top of the hill.

I have been in contact with both Hertfordshire Police and NHDC about the situation and I encourage you to also report your concerns to them too. *The more people who complain directly, the stronger my case is with them.*

You can do this by ringing the non-emergency police number on 101 or using the link on the Herts Police website: https://www.herts.police.uk/ro/report/asb/asb-v3/report-antisocial-behaviour/ This is taken directly from their website:

You can report these to us online
If the vehicle is parked:
over a dropped kerb

on a pedestrian crossing (including the area marked by the zig-zag lines) in spaces reserved for Blue Badge holders, residents or motorbikes (unless entitled to do so)

in marked taxi bays, cycle lanes or red lines near a school entrance, bus or tram stop


Christmas Jumpers
