#### Bauble making is underway!


Mrs Peddie's bauble factory is up and running! Make sure you place your 2023 Christmas bauble order ASAP to secure your spot on the school tree this year.

# Even if you're late ON'T PARK NEAR OUR GATE

Stopping here puts children in danger.

Parking near schools will never be an easy task, especially for schools like ours in rural locations with narrow roads and pavements. It may be tempting to try and park as close to school as possible, particularly when the weather is dark and unpleasant. However, some parking choices are simply dangerous.

One of the most dangerous places to park is on the double yellow lines close to, or even worse, overlapping the school gate (which is sadly becoming increasingly common).

When this is blocked, if cars need to pull in to give way to oncoming traffic, their only option is to pull into the top of the drive by the gate – which can be filled with parents, pupils, toddlers and prams.

Please ensure that you make safe, legal parking choices; this applies to Early Bird Club drop off, and after school clubs.

Well done everyone. Although you didn't get what you hoped for, we are all still proud of your medal winning position.








