Following the letter from our Governing Body at the end of term, thank you to everyone who is making a conscious effort to improve the parking situation outside school; we absolutely acknowledge that our rural location is tricky, but it is possible to have a smooth drop off and pick up time if everyone plays their part.

However, this week we have received the following email from a local resident; please do be mindful of people's residential properties as it is important that we have strong, positive relationships with our local community.

We are one of the closest neighbours to your school, down the hill from the Church. Please could । request that you ask your school community not to block or partially block residential or agricultural entrances at drop off and pick up times. Blocking the agricultural gateways inconveniences people getting on with their day but parking across the dropped curb outside Long Barn and Brookend Farmhouse is dangerous.

We appreciate these times are busy and parking can be difficult but if a car parks across the dropped curb to the entrance of Long Barn and Brookend Farmhouse and we are leaving our properties by car we cannot see cars coming up or down the hill when we exit or see if pedestrians are coming or going up and down the hill when we return. It is a generous amount of space for a driveway and tempting to park in for a short time, but it's obviously been done for good reason, safety.
